One of them is Jace, whom she will be pulled into a journey of vengeance with. Within only 24 hours, their journey begins when Clary herself is attacked by a demon and when her mother is abducted by the demons. Who could the Fray be? why would demons have quarrels with ordinary humans like Clary and her Mother? Clary nor the Shadowhunters know the answer to that. But they will soon find out along their thrilling journey to save Clary's mother and to get personal vengeance.
