Fast moving plot driven action runs hand in hand with character development once more in this volume. Killua reveals he's as dangerous as he confided to Gon that he is while Kurapika, Leorio, and Hisoka all

Gon vs Sedokan was a pretty boring match. Once Gon figured out there was a trick making his candle burn faster, he wasted no time in wiping out Sedokan's flame. It was so easy that it was rather pathetic... Gon on the sidelines, however, is freaking hilarious as he tries to puzzle out people's reasoning for things - like with Leorio and his 'fight' with the girl. But Gon really shines in his friendships with the others. They've known each other for a handful of days, but it is already easy to see that Gon has strong bonds with each of them. Also, we learn that Gon is a lot smarter than he looks - knowing that he will not be able to best Hisoka in skill, he instead focuses on being stealthy.

Killua I swear the whatever gods people listen to that THIS KID is my damn favorite. He pretty much solidified it during his fight. It's Killua vs Johness, a guy who has murdered over 146 people AT LEAST, and who is serving a sentence of 968 years. One of Johness crimes that stands out is the fact that he ripped the heart out of an 11 year olds chest while the boy was awake and conscious the whole time... so naturally, it's only right that 11 year old Killua return the favor and rip out the heart of this man. It was one of the most karmic scenes of the volume, and goes to show that underestimating an enemy - no matter the age - can be a fatal mistake...

Leorio vs Leroute was both hilarious and ridiculous. Like, he was doing so well at the beginning, but then he just had to get a look at the girl's downstairs business... What a moron.

Kurapika vs Majtani was even more bothersome than Leorio and Leroute... mostly because Kurapika pissed me off at the end. I get it, you don't want to strike a dude when they're down... but when you don't know if they'll even wake up before time is up, and when you're endangering not only your chance to pass, but the chances of people who have become your friends (not you Tonpa, you jerk), it makes you come off as selfish.
