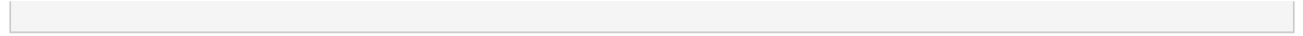

The story felt like the two authors thought they should give the mankind a gift—their collaboration of a book—and then they dived in headlong. I'm finding difficult to review this book. I'm in between feelings about it because although I liked the plot, there's something that it doesn't feel right. There's some inconsistencies, answers we don't get in the end...

The blurb was what made me read this book.

It's interesting, taboo even. Suspenseful and dark.

Written in dual POV, the reader gets to know the characters feelings and hopes, making it interesting to read. It's fast paced, gritty, with some abusive scenes... There's nothing romantic about it. Although there is a HEA, the romantic part of it is almost null. There's rape, abusive scenes and delusional characters.

Audrey lives with her parents since she was 14, in a Community that strips them off of everything they had before they arrived.

Basically it's a Cult lead by Father Weston, a polygamist with 4 wives, a sadistic delusional man that chosen Audrey at 19 to be this fifth wife.

Then there's Kiev, his son, that came back for revenge.

As soon as Audrey sees Kiev, right after her marriage, the lust is evident between them. Kiev is torn between keeping his revenge and keeping Audrey to himself saving her and destroying the Community...

It's here that the inconsistencies start... Although Audrey and Kiev don't want Father Weston to take Audrey virginity, Kiev does that himself, in a scene that not being a rape, it's not romantic either...

Once again I find myself reading Marata Eros, but now with a darkish theme, and popping my cherry with Emily Goodwin. The result is that I really liked the product of these two authors working together.

Despite having already read this kind of theme in a book (religious cult and bad leader) from one of my favorite authors, I found myself turning pages and looking forward to what was coming.

Here is more or less the blurb of the story. Audrey is the next Chosen. A girl whose soul and body belongs to the community. A girl who carries the responsibility to save the community from damnation. However, she starts doubting the so-called fate and prophecies that Father Weston feeds the community with once she meets Father's Weston's son, Kiev.

Kiev is looking for revenge, and there's no better revenge than destroying all of what his father has built and power. And, what better way of starting than taking his beloved Chosen to start his plans.

One of Many is told in dual POV's, Audrey's and Kiev's. As the authors wisely warn, this book contains violent scenes and there's sexual abuse, too.

I had the honor of BETA reading this book and I can honestly say that it is one of my favorite dark reads ever!

The authors do a fantastic job in capturing the wrongness and depravity of this cult! Let me start from the story.

We meet Audrey. She is a young woman and her family is a member to religious cult.

The **Community** saved her family and so now, it is time to pay the price.

Audrey has to marry Father Weston, the cult's leader, and join his other four wives at his home. She is the Chosen One.

Not having another choice, Audrey's hand is given to the much older man and so her journey to hell begins. In Father Weston's house, there are rules and Audrey must learn to obey them. What she didn't expect was to meet Kiev, Father Weston's son.

Kiev is a tattooed rebel. He had escaped the Community but he returned after finishing his education. He is the exact opposite of his father, he sees the cult for what it really is and he intends to destroy his father's seedy empire. The women in the house are intimidated by him and he rather enjoys it.

It's okay if the wives fear me. The real monster shares their beds, but they feel better thinking it's me.

Kiev's mother was the first wife but she is long gone. That has marked him.

When he meets Audrey, his plan will take an unexpected detour.

I'm supposed to make the first move in my plan. I'm the boss of the destruction of the Community. Not her. Not a wife.

What I loved about this book was Audrey. She is not your usual heroine. You don't often find a heroine like her in cult romances. Audrey is not brainwashed.
