Heartsick, Regan follows, joining the Wild Bill Hickok/Charlie Utter expedition that offered miners protection while traveling to the gold fields in the midst of hostilities between the Sioux and the miners encroaching into their Holy Wilderness. During the expedition, Regan is befriended by Wild Bill who is charmed by her spirit and courage. In return, she is intrigued by his heroic history and delights in taking photographs of him for her collection. When she meets with Aiden, a new menace forces them to remain apart. To salve her broken heart, she spends the summer hard at work, collecting photographs of the teeming town of miners and other locations in the Black Hills. She is often confused and bewildered by the growing conflict between the whites' and the Sioux, the miners' hatred of the Indians on whose hunting ground they are digging for gold. Ultimately, another encounter with Aiden ignites a crisis of the heart that forces him and Regan to remain estranged. Defeated and bereft, Regan returns to Colorado Territory. Once back with Lareina, she recovers her faith and tenacity and vows to unlock the mystery that still threatens their future... Behold A Lone Horseman is a feast for the heart and imagination. Readers who enjoy a story of intricate suspense with depth of character set against a colorful historic backdrop will love this novel that will keep them reading long into the night

In the spirit of full disclosure, I received a free uncorrected copy of "Behold a Lone Horseman" by Jeannie Hudson, through Goodreads' First Reads Giveaway. I LOVE historical fiction, and this one had lots to offer about the Denver territory in the late 1800s. Seventeen-year-old Regan leaves her home (and her cold, emotionless mother) behind in Philadelphia a year after her photographer father's death to start her own studio - and even more importantly, her goal of taking photos for a collection of the rapidly changing West. Although she'll be living with her beloved aunt, Lareina, a journalist working for the Denver Chronicle, she is very independent and mature for someone so young. The novel pulls in a number of familiar names like Buffalo Bill Cody and Wild Bill Hickok, among a myriad of other colorful characters. Learning so much about the early techniques used in photography was fascinating. Having lived near Denver (Boulder) myself for almost a decade in the 70s, I LOVED the descriptions of the city, the foothills and the rougher mining territories. Hudson's writing was so descriptive I could practically smell the aspen trees and the wonderful scent of mountain air! The book was very well written and kept me turning the pages far into the night when I should have been sleeping. In addition to her aunt, Regan's most important relationship is with Aiden, a

handsome older man she meets on the train on the way to Denver. Their mutual attraction is instantaneous, and quite a bit of the story revolved around it. I'm not a huge fan of romance novels, and I would have rather read more about Denver and the Old West. Hudsen handles the romantic details deftly, but I might have given this book five stars if less time had been devoted to the intimate details of the budding romance and the roadblocks constantly thrown in the way of these two coming together. Overall, I greatly enjoyed reading this book and would definitely recommend it to anyone who enjoys good writing and stories about the American West!
