I just read this book in one sitting- it's a light and easy read with a LOT of spice. Although a bit unexpected, I did enjoy reading it. Farm Boy is the first book in the Homegrown Duet. It is a southern romance, set on a farm (I love these kinds of books), and introduces readers to Millie and Drew. At first, these two despise one another - enemies to lovers and all that-. Millie can't stand him because she finds him cocky and arrogant and Drew doesn't care for her because he's attracted to her but can't have her (family disapproval? maybe. Secrets hidden in the past? Hmm..). So one could gather from this that there is a bit of angst when it comes to them building a relationship. However, despite their initial distaste for one another, fireworks somehow explode and lead them to the bedroom (or the back of a truck, idk). Now, for me, the way they came together was really fast especially considering how much they didn't like one another. I felt like something was skipped in between and almost got whiplash when I read that they were falling in bed together. Perhaps a little more buildup would have made the story feel more real to me as a reader? Maybe. There was just something missing- something I really wished were added to the story to make it more realistic.
