Ella and Maddy are best friends, but one day Maddy announces that she has to go away for a year and asks Ella to take care of Marmalade, her cat. Ella is very very sad, and at first Ella and Marmalade both seem in a funk about the change that has taken place since Maddy has gone away.

One autumn, Maddy told Ella that she is going away for a year and asked her to take care of her cat, Marmalade. Both Ella and Marmalade cry and cry when Maddy leaves. Ella can't find anyone to play in the leaves with her, pick and munch apples, or stomp in puddles. Then one frosty morning, Ella wakes up to find her feet warm and Marmalade sleeping on her bed. As winter arrives, Ella and Marmalade get closer and closer. Spring comes and the two work together in the garden and head to the beach together. Maddy returns with the autumn, but what will happen now with Marmalade?

This book is a smart mix of waiting for a friend to return and seasons. Along the way, there is also the chance to make a new friend too. The dance of the seasons moves the story along nicely, creating a timeline along which readers can see the relationship between Ella and Marmalade growing and changing.

It is the illustrations that make this book more than just a book about friendship in a crowded picture book market. McKenzie combines black and white line drawings with bursts of color. Marmalade is always shown as a pop of orange, while the human characters remain black and white. The effect has an appealing lightness.

A picture book about moving, friendships and change, this lovely little picture book would make a nice addition to units on seasons as well. Appropriate for ages 3-5.

Ella's best friend, Maddy, has to go away for a whole year. She asks Ella to take care of her cat, Marmalade, while she's gone. Ella and Marmalade pass the year on the frozen pond, reading by the fireplace, planting a flower garden, and swimming at the beach as they await Ella's return. When autumn comes again, so does Ella, and now the two best friends are a trio that includes Marmalade. In what I think is a terrific ending, Ella's daddy builds a cat-flap in the fence between the two girls' houses just the right size for Marmalade, and the girls, too.

The simple story of friendship is sweet and Heath McKenzie's illustrations are an absolutely perfect companion. The black-and-white line drawings feature big, round eyes on the girls and Marmalade, and curls of hair and branches. While Marmalade is always in full color, only portions of the other images are stamped with vibrant colors that emphasize each season.

I'm pretty sure my daughter would call the pictures "super cute!"

This book clearly shows the changing of the seasons throughout the course of a year and would fit nicely into a classroom unit on the seasons. I think I would have students list the activities that Ella and Marmalade did during each of the seasons.

"A Year With Marmalade" is the story of how a Maddy's best friend Ella goes away for a year, leaving her pet cat (Marmalade) in Maddy's care. At first Maddy is upset, but soon Marmalade becomes a comfort to her.

Given that Reynolds usually writes books with very clear cut lessons/messages involved (Teddy Shares, Let's Save Water, etc), this sort of book isn't a surprise. At a glance, "A Year With Marmalade" seems like a perfectly good book for comforting your child when their friend goes away for a while.

However, it's probably a little too specific to be that helpful to most children. Not only does her friend Ella come back, but Maddy is also given a cat to keep her company in the meantime. I feel like most of the time, friends move away permanently and are given no consolation like a cat. So it's really only useful in very specific cases.

Mind you, I am only thinking about this from the perspective of a book vendor. Reynolds doesn't have to write a book that's useful for me to recommend to parents. It just seems a waste to sell a book with a message, if the message doesn't really apply to most kids.

The reason I am so hung up on the message as a selling point is, is that the book really isn't that interesting otherwise. It's probably not going to sell very well on its own. The illustrations are nicer than in most of her books, I will say that!

A tale of friendship. Ella's friend leaves with her family for a year, but leaves her cat Marmalade with her. Their shared loss slowly turns into shared friendship. They take comfort in one another, and play together, and when Maddy finally returns they all have fun. From the beginning it is known that Maddy will return, so the impact of their loss is not as great as it could have been, but the bond that forms between them is evident

thanks to the wonderful illustrations. The children are drawn simply in black and white, while most else has colour. Their big eyes help to express the range of emotions they feel. Also, the words mimic the events: fonts change for weather, the words fall with the apples, show emotions by being bigger and bolder, etc. All in all it may not be the best fleshed out story, but everything else about it is of a high quality.
