I love the artwork and story in this series. I especially love how the actual pairing off happened so quickly in relation to other series, which I like. As the title suggests, there is some sexual content in here and if you don't want to see manga boobs you'd best prepare yourself to see them. The content gets more graphic in the last volume, but generally sticks to hints, glimpses, and talk up until volume 17.
