" Special Delivery" the first novel in the "Mountain Meadow Homecomings" which I won from Goodreads/ First Reads is a heart-warming, adventurous romance that begins when sparks fly between Holly Morgan and Assistant Police Chief Jake Allred after he delivers her baby in an isolated and decrepit house near Mountain Meadow during a winter storm. Also woven into their love story is the rebirth of a passionate love affair between Holly's doctor Jenny Owens and Jake's neighbour Evan Richardson whose teenage romance years before was destroyed by a vicious lie. Both couples must overcome the demons in their past if their love is to survive.

Set in a town nestled in the Blue Ridge Mountains of Virginia Holly intends to hide out from her abusive ex-fiancé Spence, heir to the Dilby fortune until her baby is born, but finds her life turned upside down when Assistant Police Chief Jake Allred delivers her baby by flashlight during a brutal winter storm. Trusting Jake, love ignites between them only to be thwarted by Spence who's determined to kidnap the baby for his fiancé Seely who is unable to have children.

In contrast Holly's doctor Jenny Owens suffers from an abusive and tragic incident in her past that destroyed her relationship with Evan Richardson, a County attorney. Torn apart by lies, secrets and deception Jenny finally confronts Evan with the horrible truth that not only brings healing but sparks a love that's only lain dormant for years. As their passion flares Evan must find the courage to confront his father's treachery if their love is to survive.

On the verge of Christmas the author heightens tension and suspense with a kidnapping and arrests that rock the small town already plagued by theft at the Baptist and Presbyterian Churches. The story never loses momentum as strands of the plot twist and turn with a Christmas mystery ,and romance as well as an attempted murder. Yet for all the controversy, fear and upheaval that threatens not only the couples who've found love but the warmth of fellowship in Mountain Meadow, elements of forgiveness ,courage and faith shine through.

Although imperfect with all their flaws, the characters in their struggle to overcome adversity are unforgettable, adding passion, energy and drama to this captivating story. Holly Morgan is cautious, defensive and prickly, a young woman with trust issues when she initially meets Jake Allred. Yet as she gets to know the kind, capable and patient Assistant Police Chief she warms to his generosity of spirit and his patience. Tyler Morgan, Holly's eleven year old brother is conscientious, and thoughtful, wanting to protect and help provide for his sister after not only the death of their parents but from the hot-tempered, vicious bully Spence Dilby. Evan Richardson at first is cynical, sarcastic and intimidating until he learns the truth of the tragedy that robbed him of the woman he loved. Dr. Jenny Owens haunted by abuse and heartbreak is smart, feisty and tough, helping to bring justice to the man that tried to destroy her.

Special Delivery by Laura Browning should have been released five months ago and been named Christmas Angels. Sadly this book just didn't do it for me. It was fine it was well written and the story was good, but there was so much of the story I wished was different. The blurb makes you think it is solely about Holly and Jake but it's not, simultaneously and not as a sub plot is Jenny and Evans story. It was as if it were two books in one with the common factor of Holly because without Holly none of it would have happened. Things happened fairly quickly and I wish they hadn't; with both stories when the change happened it was a complete almost instant 180 change. I know you could probably argue that Jenny and Evan's change could have and should have been that instantaneous, I just didn't like it. I did like the characters they are very likeable and I liked the conflict but that's about it.

Holly is very pregnant, unfortunately the father of her unborn baby has proved himself to be a crazy bastard he has repeatedly threatened her and her little brother, Tyler. Spencer at first would not acknowledge the baby as his but when his fiance, the woman his parents picked for him, tells him she can never have kids he decides that Holly's baby will fill in just fine and will do anything to take that baby from Holly. Holly knowing something bad is going to happen packs up her brother in the car and leaves driving to nowhere in general just getting herself as far away from Spence as possible. Luck is on her side Tyler and Holly find themselves at a little valley nestled in the mountains that seems pleasant enough and small enough to safely hide.

Jake Allred is ready to settle down, he wants a wife and kids he already has the big house just waiting for the perfect woman to spend the rest of his life with and then he meet Holly. Not even her obvious distrust for him deters him from making friends with Tyler and firmly situating himself into her life and when she goes into early labor and he delivers a beautiful baby girl during a snowstorm with no electricity Holly finally admits she wants him as much as he wants her.

Meanwhile Jenny and Evan are Jake's best friends and they use to date but something happened in the past that tore them apart. The horrible truth finally comes out and mends the rift between them. Evan as a lawyer can not let the past goes he must do something about it even if that means tearing his family apart and a couple of town officials.

The situation with Spence finally comes to a climatic conclusion. It paid off in the end it had a good ending but certain parts were cheesy in an eighties sitcom way.

Being from that family he's from, the restraining order he has against him means nothing. For the police just turn their backs or a blind eye. This move is heart wrenching but she can't let him hurt Tyler or the baby who is yet to be born.

You see Holly and Tyler's parents were killed a year ago in a car accident and Tyler was injured in the same accident. She had met Spence a little before that but the push to be with her was on once they passed. Not knowing it was her first time he took her rough. Which only made her not want it again until after they were to be married if even. Spence started to change though not being as kind, saying cruel things in front of others.
