“Quest Two: The Cursed Nile” by S.W. Lothian is the follow-up story to “Quest One: The Golden Scarab”, and is every bit as action-packed and thrill-filled as its predecessor. This author has blazed a new trail for writers of Adventure Fiction taking place in ancient Egypt.

Rani, JJ and Linc, our heroes from the first tale, are reunited at the request of the god, Horus to resolve another devastating problem: the Nile has dried up... overnight. At the same time, the god of the Nile, Hapi, was taken away under cover of darkness, his destination unknown. Can the three children from our time once again save ancient Egypt from the wicked intentions of another god gone bad? Or will this quest be their downfall?

“The Cursed Nile” is an exciting and suspenseful tale of good overcoming evil, against terrific odds. This time the three modern-day pre-teens are joined in their effort by Rani’s long lost best friend, Patra, as well as the very animated statues, Ata, Atsu, and Little Sphinx. As it turns out, the extra help was needed, and very much appreciated.

The wicked former god of the Nile, Sobek, is presumed by the Alliance to be responsible for kidnapping Hapi and removing the water from the Nile, but Sobek has not been seen for many years, and nobody knows where he might have taken Hapi. Only by coordinating their efforts and relying on Horus for aid when

needed, can our heroes succeed in this, their second Quest to save ancient Egypt. Their many exploits, complications and impediments provide the reader with greatly engaging entertainment.

The character development is exceptional; the author has a remarkable talent for creating very likeable and lovable heroes out of normal pre-teens. I strongly recommend this book, AFTER you read the first one. And I am anxiously awaiting the opportunity to read "Quest Three: The Fallen Pharaoh", soon to be released. These books are intended to appeal to pre-teens and young teens, but I assure you the appeal is just as great for adults; start reading and see if you don't agree.

The second book in the Quest series sees our heroes JJ, Linc and Rani summoned back to Ancient Egypt to solve the riddle of the disappearance of the Water-God Hapi, along with the waters of the Nile. What the top god Horus doesn't know is that in modern day Egypt, the Nile waters have also disappeared. Thus we are set for a time-travelling puzzle that bounces from ancient to modern mixing real landmarks and delightful inventions to produce a beautifully described, heartwarming, exciting adventure.

Mr Lothian's attention to detail in describing the Nile and its islands bring the whole setting to life – including the dry riverbed. I loved the exploration of an island where some statues had taken refuge as a sort of commune. Statues had their movement enabled thanks to the trio's earlier exploits, and this group found pressures of 'modern' life all too much to bear. But they are pressed into service, and once more Mr Lothian's superb descriptive skills capture the imagination as the statues and the trio approach their enemy.

It's a pacy, thought-provoking adventure, a jewel in the raft of middle grade time travel books, and to my mind the best of the Quest so far. And there's no trouble with reading them out of order, either. I'm looking forward to number 4!

The waters of the Nile have disappeared, not just in the past but in the present, and Hapi the beloved God of the Nile has vanished, with the only witness a quivering little Sphinx.

JJ, Linc and Rani are once again called on by Horus to take up the quest to find Hapi and rescue the waters of the Nile before they are lost forever in past and present.

Since their first quest, a great alliance was made with Statues and Humans, walking the Earth together. The questor's accept the challenge, with the help of Little Sphinx, who brings such a great comedic element to the story with the most hilarious lisp I have ever read. It reminded me of another great lisping character in Terry Pratchett's *The Thief of Time*. The addition of the twin statues Atta and Atsu, a bumbling pair who seemed to increase the mayhem instead of assisting the questor's, made this book fun from the start.

The questor's must keep their wits about them and work together to find a way to defeat the evil Sobek the God of the crocodiles.

One of my favourite parts was when Little Sphinx lost his nose, I won't spoil it but take a look at photo's of the Sphinx today, you will laugh out loud as you read that part of the story.

The lyrical delight of the first volume in the "Quest" series—"The Golden Scarab"—continues apace in this new entry relating the new series of events in this magical fantasy saga. The delightful storytelling approach also continues here, making this an excellent choice for a parent, grandparent, or other caregiver, to share aloud with their child. In the initial novel, the Ancient Egyptian god Seth, who craved power and just couldn't get enough, wanted to take over all of Egypt, and his wise and Solomonic brother, the god Horus, summoned three youngsters from our present back to Ancient Egypt to hide the Golden Scarab, which confined Seth's powers and restrained his evil nature. Consequently, those statues of Egypt which had aided in the battles against Seth were given free reign to roam, walk, dance, and generally participate in life. Now life is good on the Nile, and the Festival of Ahket is about to begin, celebrating the god Hapi, who protects and guides the Nile, and who is ultimately responsible for the success of Egyptian agriculture—for without the Nile, there can be no harvest. No harvest is about to become a reality, though, because suddenly and inexplicably, Hapi disappears, and with him the Nile; and once again, it is up to contemporary youngsters J. J., Rani, and Linc, to solve this danger, stop the curse, and return Hapi to his rightful place. If you've already enjoyed "Quest One: The Golden Scarab," don't miss this and hurry up about it. If you haven't read "The Golden Scarab," what are you waiting on? Middle-graders, YA, and yes, adults can all find delight in this series.

Having enjoyed the first book in this series, I politely asked the author for an ARC of book 2 and I was pretty pleased when it arrived a few weeks ago. Don't get me wrong: I have plenty of reading material. Too much, in fact. But I am always anxious for the second book in a series because more often than not it is the second book that signals the trajectory of a series. That's where we find out what sort of series we are dealing with: one that surprises us with twists and turns, one that takes a disappointing departure, or one that delivers the same sort of experience we enjoyed in the first book.

In this case, the author has chosen the latter and there is little doubt those who enjoyed the first book will enjoy this one. It has the same crisp writing, narrative voice, and light touch. There is suspense, yes, but it is not overpowering. Lothian sticks well within the traditional boundaries of this genre, which is really what one hopes for when starting a book like this. I, for one, want some action and adventure when I pick up an action/adventure book, and that's exactly what this book delivers.

Having already set the stage in book one for a series of stories about kids travelling back in time to save the day, Lothian gets straight to the point: Ancient Egypt faces another crisis. All the water has disappeared from the Nile River. So, too, has Hapi, the god of the Nile who watches over the river and controls it. Baffled, the gods of Ancient Egypt send a message into the future asking the time-travelling trio of JJ, Linc, and Rani to travel back in time, find Hapi, and restore the river to its proper condition.

When the trio arrives in Ancient Egypt they discover that Hapi has been kidnapped by the evil god Sobek, who has a plan to gain control of the Nile for himself and use it to gain power over the people of Egypt. Interesting back story: Sobek was once the beloved god of the Nile himself. At least until people discovered that he was ordering crocodiles to attack them. Good lesson for the kids there: if you want to be liked, don't order crocodiles to attack people. It also adds a nice element of danger to the story; is this really the sort of god you want in charge of your water supply?

As they pursue the quest to rescue Hapi, the trio encounter all manner of obstacles, including raging waters, evil surfing statues, angry (and in one case very large) crocodiles, and of course one pretty powerful evil god. There are chase scenes, a few setbacks, and even the need to hop back and forth in time. One fun element is the addition of good statues that move about, dance, and even join in the trio's quest (one statue in particular—'Little Sphinx'—provides the sort of comic relief that will appeal to kids who chuckle at the antics of JarJar Binks).

On the whole, Lothian delivers here exactly what he did in the first book and exactly what most folks browsing this section of the bookstore are likely looking for: plenty of action, a bit of suspense, a dash of humor and an ending in which—(Oh, come on. You didn't really think I'd give away the ending, did you? You'll have to read it yourself.)
