De no haber sido así, no creo que hubiese llegado a este. Porque, sinceramente, esta historia ha sido aburrida, simplona y sin corazón.

Cillia es un personaje un tanto plano. Es guapa, muy guapa pero ella no es consciente de ello, lo que *como era de suponer* la hace mucho más deseable a ojos del protagonista, Boyd.

Su pasado ha sido uno de sufrimiento y pérdidas: La de sus padres a una edad temprana en unas circunstancias traumáticas y la de su matrimonio, cuando era muy joven y no sabía lo que quería. Y es por ello que se cierra en banda a vivir. Decide dedicar su vida a su trabajo (al que ama) y a su hermana (a la que cuida desde que sus padres fallecieron) y no quiere ni oír hablar de enamorarse de un poli (su madre fue una) ni por asomo. Aunque pensándolo bien no quiere oír ni hablar de tíos en general y punto.

I'm so glad I read first the fifth book in the series Night Shield.

Had I not, I do not think I would have come to this one. Because, honestly, this story has been boring, simple and without emotions.

Cillia is a somewhat flat character. She is beautiful, so beautiful and she is not aware of it, which *predictably* makes her much more appealing to the hero, Boyd.

Her past has been one of suffering and losses: Her parents, who died at an early age in traumatic circumstances and her marriage, she was very young and did not know what she was doing at the time. And that is why she chooses not to have a life. She decides to dedicate her life to her work (she loves it) and to her sister (whom she has cared for since her parents died) and she does not want to hear about falling in love with a cop (her mother was one). Although in reality she does not want to hear about falling for any guy in general, period.

And Boyd (the cop), who has a partner who is almost a top model, intelligent and with whom he gets along famously, decides, as soon as he saw Cillia, that she will be the love of his life. I honestly found more

Add a stalker and a few threatening calls and you already have both protagonists together. No matter that you have to skip some police procedure, no matter that the suspense is ridiculous, what matters is that the connection of them *in bed* is going to be something of another world and then more.

Short synopsis: A deejay, Cilla O'Roarke, in Denver starts getting calls from some creepazoid whose threats intensify with every phone call. The police enter the scene, one of which is Boyd Fletcher, who immediately falls for Cilla. So begins the romance.

Written for Silhouette's Intimate Moments line, Night Shift is an early Nora Roberts' romance and the first in the Night Tales series. While I didn't expect to be blown away by the story, I was hoping to be passably entertained. Unfortunately, those hopes were dashed fairly early on. I got a little taste of what was to come in the second paragraph of the first page:

"Her voice was like hot whiskey, smooth and potent. Rich, throaty, touched with the barest whisper of the South, it might have been fashioned for the airwaves. Any man in Denver who was tuned in to her frequency would believe she was speaking only to him."

Commence internal groaning and eye-rolling. So yeah, that didn't bode well. Still, I surged on, believing that Nora Roberts could make something out of the formulaic plot. Again, I was disappointed. If the focus had been more on the suspense part and less on the "romance," it could have been an okay read. Instead I had to suffer through Cilla's lame hang-ups and excuses for why she can't be in a relationship. All of which could be remedied if she'd just take the time to see a therapist. The only thing that bothered me more was her utter stupidity. She continually left out much-needed information that could help the cops figure out who was behind the threats to her life. Instead, her constant excuses were, "I didn't think of it" or "I didn't think it was important" or other such bullcrap that made me want to slap her silly (if she wasn't already that way). Boyd wasn't bad but he didn't really make a lasting impression either. From the physical description, it sounds like he might have been molded after Clint Eastwood in an homage to Play Misty for Me, but maybe I'm seeing things that aren't there.

Needless to say, the romance wasn't very interesting and bored me more often than not. Boyd pursues and Cilla waffle-waffles throughout the whole book. She's healed after one night in Boyd's bed and then remembers her "reasons" for not getting serious. He's in love with her after one day (I exaggerate, but only slightly), when they hadn't even had very many conversations to get to know each other, which I suppose isn't very important if, I don't know, you want to spend the rest of your lives together. Not to mention, I never got the impression that Cilla was ever in love with him, even at the end. So much tell and no show. The only thing of note were two secondary characters, Althea Grayson and Natalie Fletcher, partner and sister of Boyd, respectively. I'm hoping, if I decide to read them, that their books will be better. Otherwise, this is wholly forgettable and makes me wish for my time back.

Put an attractive looking detective investigating the case and the harassed female DJ who has voice of silk and POOF! - Nora Roberts manages to whip a romantic (At times, erotic) tale out of the blue. Nora Roberts is an acquired taste (for me). She isn't an author to like on the first take, and it took a while for me to really appreciate her. I needed to get used to her narrative style, so different from other authors out there. But I came to like her, though it usually still takes a couple of chapters as warm-up.

I absolutely adored this first installation in the *Night Tales* series, and though it was written 20 (!!!) years ago, it still works (if you forget the fact they constantly use pay-phones instead of mobile ones ;)). Anyway, I loved it.

The style was typical Roberts. A bit choppy, yet effective after those few warm-up chapters. And I appreciate the fact Boyd wasn't the usual slightly-Betsy Roberts character, but had a lot of Alpha in him. Good for him, good for Cilla, and good for me as the reader.

The characterization was great, the suspense was amazing, the pacing spot-on...And I didn't figure out the villain until the end, which is amazing for me after a few suspense novels where I could spot the baddie from page one.

In short, this was a great little story in a great little series, but what I liked most about it was the heroine being really tough, instead of just pretending to be tough, talking tough and then going all TSTL on us.
